### Dr Richard Waller

#### *The Climate is Changing: What on Earth can I do about it?*

A Senior Lecturer within the School of Geography, Geology and Environment at Keele University, Richard has been fascinated by cold environments since he studied geography at school and has spent the last 25 years working in glacial and permafrost environments, studying the nature and accelerating landscape impacts of Arctic climate change.



### Dr Antonia Law

#### *Climate change - the science and the solutions.*

Dr Antonia Law is Senior Lecturer in Geography at Keele University, where she is also Deputy Director for Education in the Institute for Sustainable Futures with responsibility for embedding sustainability in the curriculum and co-curriculum. Antonia is fascinated with understanding the impact of climate change and anthropogenic pollutants on lake and river systems and has worked in glacial lakes

and rivers in the Arctic. She is committed to delivering education for sustainability and climate change, to make the world a better place for future generations.



### Hannah Hooper

#### *Building a resilient future in the face of the climate crisis.*

Hannah Hooper is the Programmes Coordinator at Force of Nature, a youth non-profit organisation mobilising mindsets for climate action. Hannah is a passionate climate activist, and avid researcher into the intersection between regenerative cultures, community care, and planetary well-being. Her interest in these different aspects of individual experience has led her move into the environmental space,

to contribute to working with others to find solutions to the climate crisis. She is also a speaker and youth consultant for organisations.

#### *How we're reducing our environmental impact.*

# Workshops and Partnerships



## Force of Nature

### *Anxiety to Agency.*

In this workshop, students learn how to understand the relationship between mental health, mindset and climate change; identify the barriers to taking action; hone in on the problem they want to solve and get clear on their vision of the future.



## The National Grid

### *The transition to electric vehicles.*

In this interactive workshop, participants will be split into several groups, each given a map of a road network and a budget. Using this budget, they must create an electric charging network that allows a transition to electric vehicles. Coming up with the best solution possible, each group will be given a set of 'constraints' that they must work within, such as:

- Environmentally sensitive zones
- High-cost zones
- Just transition regions (Disadvantaged areas which need greater provision of public charging)
- No build areas
- High traffic zones
- Limits of EV range

## 4ward Futures

CASLOE is a careers education project that has been developed by 4wardFutures. CASLOE uses the climate and ecological challenges humanity faces, such as climate change and plastic waste as a metaphor to introduce young people to the different progression and career pathways that will enable them to address these challenges in their future careers.

### *Creating a Sustainable Life on Earth (CASLOE) Workshop*

Following a 30 minute pre-event webinar, students will be set the challenge to work in teams to put together a plan of how professionals from different sectors could work together to address an environmental challenge in the workshop, such as poor air quality, water pollution or the impact of waste plastic in the oceans'.



## UK Atomic Energy Authority.

Students will learn about the power of plasma and Fusion Energy and how UKAEA are looking to create a 'star in a jar' to provide near limitless sustainable energy.

There will be a 20 minute talk on fusion and how it will impact a future sustainable energy mix, a 20 minute workshop and 10 minutes for a Q&A.
