Day 1

Berlin in the Cold War: the Eastern perspective

Museum Berlin-Karlshorst

Subject to availability

End of the Third Reich. The Soviet 'liberation' of Berlin. Genesis of the Cold War Self-guided tour with audio guides.

Treptow Park Soviet Memorial

The significance of Berlin to the Soviets and the scale of losses. Mother Russia and the Soviet Liberator. Relief carvings showing the events of the Great Patriotic War. The purpose of the park. Soviet propaganda and its place today.

Stalinallee

The Karl-Marx-Allee is a monumental socialist boulevard built by the German Democratic Republic between 1951 and 1964 in Berlin. First named Stalinallee, the boulevard was a flagship building project for East Germany's reconstruction after the Second World War.

Alexanderplatz

The heart of old East Berlin; Soviet era architecture and murals.

DDR museum

Subject to availability

Excellent interactive museum which focuses on everyday life in East Germany; a chance to sit in a Trabbie, try on the 'latest fashions' and see how East Germans spent their holidays.

OR

Alltag in der DDR

"Everyday life in the GDR" An interactive exhibition presented by the Museum in the Kulturbrauerei which shows the real living and working conditions of the people in the GDR.

'The Bridge of Spies'; espionage in the Cold War; the story of Gary Powers; individual stories.

Allied Museum

Self-guided tour

The Soviet blockade and the Allied response; the Berlin Airlift.

Berlin Wall and Documentation Centre

Preserved section of the Berlin wall with aerial view of the whole area; the division of Germany; the Airlift; establishment of GDR and FRG; the exodus of East Germans to the West; origins, purpose and nature of the Wall; individual stories.

The focus is on the global rivalry between the USSR and USA, including ideology, proxy wars, the space race and Olympic games, making it especially relevant to pupils studying Superpower Rivalry at GCSE or A' Level.
